

# EMCO imposed in 7 localities in Selangor, KL, Sabah and Terengganu

**KUALA LUMPUR:** Seven more localities in Selangor, Kuala Lumpur, Sabah and Terengganu will be placed under the Enhanced Movement Control Order (EMCO) for two weeks from tomorrow.

Senior Minister (Security Cluster) Datuk Seri Ismail Sabri Yaakob said for Selangor, the three localities in Petaling include Mentari Court, PJS 8; Taman Perumahan SS 91A, Sungai Way; and Pangsapuri Westlite-PKNS.

“The Health Ministry recorded a high infectivity rate in the three localities, with 137 cases in Mentari Court, PJS 8; 64 in Taman Perumahan SS91A; and 215 at Pangsapuri Westlite-PKNS,” he said yesterday.

In Kuala Lumpur, the areas that will be placed under EMCO are Pantai Ria People’s Housing Project and Taman Bukit Angkasa.

“Of 861 tests conducted at Pantai Ria PPR, 171 were positive, while 153 out of 697 residents tested in Taman Bukit Angkasa were positive.”

In Tawau, Sabah, Kampung Balung Cocos will be placed under EMCO after recording a positivity rate of 33.33 per cent.

Kampung Kubang Jela in Mukim Manir Terengganu, Kuala Terengganu, will be placed under EMCO after recording a positivity rate of 54.3 per cent.

“The Health Ministry reports that the number of cases has increased in a short time, with a high infectivity rate in the localities.

“After a risk assessment and on the advice of the Health Ministry, the government has agreed to place the localities under EMCO from July 1 to 14.”

Meanwhile, the government lift-

ed the EMCO in several areas in Sabah and two localities in Kuching, Sarawak.

In Sabah, the areas are Country Heights Apartment and Vista Minintod Apartment (Penampang), Taman Ehsan PPR (Kudat), Kampung Rancangan and Kampung Kijang Merotai (Kalabakan), Kampung Tanjung Batu Tengah and Taman Semarak Megah (Tawau) and Kampung Rampayan and Kampung Kionsom Kecil (Kota Kinabalu).

In Kuching, the localities are Kampung Goebilt and Kampung Muara Tebas.

On a related issue, Ismail Sabri

said the government had tightened conditions for people entering Labuan, including mandatory quarantine, from tomorrow.

He said considering the Covid-19 situation on the island, the government agreed that all travellers entering Labuan must undergo a reverse transcription polymerase chain reaction (RT-PCR) swab test three days before arrival.

Labuan residents must complete a 10-day quarantine at home, while civil servants entering the Federal Territory must undergo the 10-day quarantine at home or at a hotel.

“Visitors from other countries

must quarantine for 14 days at their hotels.

“Transporter Daily Card holders must undergo RT-PCR swab tests every two weeks and must undergo Antigen Rapid Test Kit (RTK-Ag) tests weekly.

“Crew sign-ons are only allowed for Malaysian nationals and they must quarantine for 14 days and take the RT-PCR test on day 10.”

He said entry rules for Labuan were still being enforced, adding that people who had been vaccinated would be given priority.

“Sign-off is allowed with a 14-day quarantine and a RT-PCR test must be taken. Non-convention-

al ships (*kapal kumpit*) are temporarily suspended.”

In the past 14 days, Labuan recorded 1,650 Covid-19 cases.

Meanwhile, three factories and nine other premises were ordered to close on Monday after they were found violating government directives and the Movement Control Order standard operating procedures (SOP).

This followed checks by the SOP Compliance Operations Task Force, which conducted 93,459 checks and Covid-19 snap checks nationwide on Monday, including at 1,902 factories and 11,478 business premises.
