FULLY vaccinated, but still fully cautious.

That was the general sentiment of residents at Kampung Malaysia Tambahan in Cheras, Kuala Lumpur, who received their second dose of the Covid-19 vaccine through the Federal Territories Ministry's MyMedic@Wilayah Vaccine Truck programme which ended on Saturday.

Many residents from nearby Kampung Malaysia Raya and Razak Mansion told StarMetro that although fully vaccinated, they were in no hurry to go out and would continue to adhere to standard operating procedures (SOP).

Meanwhile, Roslan Mahmud from Kampung Malaysia Raya said he would wait at least two to three months before considering dining in at eateries with his family.

Kuala Lumpur achieved its herd immunity target last week after 85% of the city's adult population were vaccinated against Covid-19.

Over 168,000 residents, mostly senior citizens, the infirm and persons with disabilities were inoculated under the mobile vaccination programme.

The campaign was a collaboration between Federal Territories Ministry, Health Ministry, DBKL and the Federal Territories Foundation.
