CITY HALL OPERATION

4 KL eateries penalised for obstructing walkways

KUALA LUMPUR: The Kuala Lumpur City Hall conducted another operation targeting food premises in Jalan Petaling on Friday.

In a Facebook post, City Hall said four eateries were penalised for illegally placing chairs, tables, stalls, canopies and gas cylinders on pedestrian walkways.

"This special operation was led by Enforcement Department director Noor Azman Mahlin and involved 32 officers, targeting business premises that commit obstruction offences. "The operation also targeted premises operating without a licence, managed by foreign nationals."

City Hall said four compounds were issued under Section 46 of the Street, Drainage and Building Act 1974, one under the Advertisement By-laws 1982 and six under the Road Traffic Rules 1959.

It said 80 items were seized in the operation.

It reminded business premises owners to ensure they adhere to licensing rules and not obstruct public places and pathways.
