

Nearly 2,000 take part in Tok Gajah Run

KUALA LUMPUR: The first-ever Tok Gajah Kuala Lumpur Run held here was lively and a success, drawing the participation of nearly 2,000 Pahang-born children.

The run was flagged off by Pahang Menteri Besar Datuk Seri Wan Rosdy Wan Ismail at 7am yesterday at Dataran Dewan Bandaraya Kuala Lumpur.

Wan Rosdy said the event was historic for Pahang as it was organised for the first time following the establishment of the Perantau Anak Pahang Secretariat earlier this month.

"*Alhamdulillah*, there are many participants. I was told that nearly 2,000 Pahang-born people residing in the capital joined the Tok Gajah Run.

"Through this 5km to 7km Tok Gajah Run, we can strengthen the bonds among the Pahang people. *Insha'Allah*, we will organise this again," he told a press conference after the run.

Wan Rosdy said aside from organising various activities, the secretariat also serves as a medium for the Pahang people residing outside the state to obtain information about the state's developments.

"Besides information being available through social media platforms, they can also visit the Pahang Diaspora Secretariat office at Level 6, World Trade Centre Kuala Lumpur here," he said.
