

RENTING OUT PREMISES TO FOREIGNERS

CITY HALL MAY REVOKE TRADERS' LICENCE

Minister awaiting more info on locals 'giving' permits to illegal foreign traders

KUALA LUMPUR

KUALA Lumpur City Hall will revoke or suspend the licences of traders in Jalan Silang, here, who violate business regulations by renting out their premises to foreigners.

Minister in the Prime Minis-

ter's Department (Federal Territories) Dr Zaliha Mustafa said they were awaiting information from the police's General Operations Force over an integrated operation in Jalan Silang on Thursday.

"The traders should make the most of the licences that have been granted to them and not 'give'

them to foreigners to run businesses. We should conduct such operations on other premises.

"So, I'm obtaining more information about it (the operation)... it is also one of City Hall's priorities to address the issue of illegal foreign traders in main business locations in the federal capital," she said after attending the key-handover event for Rumah Kasih Harapan Kak Wan Series 3 here yesterday.
