

SLIGHT DROP

3,926 new Covid-19 cases, 4 deaths over past 24 hours

KUALA LUMPUR: Malaysia reported 3,926 new Covid-19 cases on Thursday, a slight drop from the 4,503 cases recorded the previous day.

The Klang Valley remained the largest contributor of new cases, making up more than half of the daily numbers, with 1,167 cases logged in Selangor, 939 in Kuala Lumpur and 92 in Putrajaya.

A total of 331 cases were recorded in Perak, 249 in Sabah, 244 in Negri Sembilan, 223 in Penang, 151 in Melaka, 142 in Kedah, 108 in Johor, 80 in Sarawak, 71 in Pahang, 61 in Kelantan, 32 in Terengganu, 24 in Labuan and 12

in Perlis.

A total of 3,542 recoveries were reported yesterday. Four deaths were registered, with one brought-in-dead case.

Up to July 28, 4,668,139 people had been infected with Covid-19, 4,584,907 of whom recovered from the infection.

A total of 35,946 deaths were recorded with 47,296 active cases.

Of the active cases, 45,657 patients were undergoing home quarantine, 1,539 have been hospitalised, 60 are being treated at Intensive Care Units (ICUs) and 30 are being monitored at the

Covid-19 quarantine and treatment centres (PKRC).

A total of 548 Covid-19 patients were admitted to hospitals yesterday. The Covid-19 bed utilisation

rate was at 25.3 per cent with 16.1 per cent at ICUs and 23.7 per cent at PKRC.

The Health Ministry identified one new high-risk group cluster

— Jalan Padang Golf 4 — in Hulu Selangor, Selangor, yesterday. Eleven cases were linked to this cluster, which has a 50 per cent positivity rate.
