

# Jalan Masjid India area safe to visit: KL City Hall

**KUALA LUMPUR:** The Masjid India Sinkhole Incident Task Force has concluded that the area and surrounding buildings

are safe to visit, said Kuala Lumpur City Hall.

In a statement, it said the sinkhole, that occurred along the

road, was an isolated incident.

Based on reports from various agencies, the area is structurally sound.

"Referring to geological information and land investigation records, the sinkhole location is situated on the Kenny Hills formation, which generally consists of schist, phyllite and quartzite rock layers," the statement read.

City Hall added that a task force meeting on Tuesday, chaired by its project management executive director Mohamad Hamim, was also attended by representatives from several agencies, who presented their findings.

The agencies included the Public Works Department, Minerals and Geosciences Department, police, Fire and Rescue Department and Indah Water Konsortium.

Representatives from the Survey and Mapping Department, Institution of Engineers Malaysia and the Malaysian Geotechnical Society were also present.

City Hall also announced it was reducing the cordoned area at the incident site, which was previously 160m long, stretching from Wisma Yakin to the Jalan Masjid India police station. – Bernama
