

OBSTRUCTING FLOW

Over 400 summonses issued in Bukit Bintang traffic operation

KUALA LUMPUR: A total of 466 summonses were issued during an operation targeting traffic obstruction and illegal motorcycle modifications in Bukit Bintang.

The operation was conducted by multiple enforcement agencies from 9pm on Friday to 12.30am yesterday.

"The operation resulted in 319 summonses being issued by the police, 92 by Kuala Lumpur City Hall (DBKL) and 55 by the Road Transport Department," said deputy police chief Datuk Azry Akmar Ayob.

Fifteen vehicles were towed away.

The operation focused on Jalan Bukit Bintang, Jalan Imbi, Jalan

Ceylon, Jalan Changkat, Jalan Berangan, Jalan Walter Granier and Jalan Tingkat Tunghsin.

"The main objective was to enforce road regulations against motorists causing obstruction or parking in prohibited areas and disrupting traffic flow," Azry Akmar said.

The operation also targeted modified motorcycles deemed unsuitable for road use.

The enforcement involved 11 officers and 82 personnel from the Kuala Lumpur Traffic Investigation and Enforcement Department, Dang Wangi Crime Prevention and Community Safety Division, the Road Transport Department and DBKL.
