

Slow response to objection process

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THERE are only three weeks to go before the closing date for objections to the draft Kuala Lumpur City Plan 2020 to be filed but response from the public has been slow.

"The Kuala Lumpur City Hall (DBKL) has only received 392 objections until today," KL mayor

Datuk Ab Hakim Borhan said during the closing ceremony of the Basic Horse Riding Course at Titiwangsa Lake yesterday.

At present, the most number of objections submitted came from the Damansara-Penchala zone with 122 objections followed by the Bukit Jalil-Seputeh zone with 76 objections while the least submissions came from Kampung Baru with only 13.

Hakim also revealed that the new panel for the Public Opinion Hearing Committee had been selected and it includes professionals from various industries such as town planners, architects, NGOs as well as representatives from the real estate sector.

"The panel will be chaired by Datin Paduka Dr Halimaton Saadiah Hashim from Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia's Institute for Environment and Development," Hakim said.

Earlier in the morning, Hakim presented certificates to 18 participants who had successfully graduated from the basic horse riding course as well as a trophy winner Mohd Hafiz Mohd Jainuri who was named the best student for the three-month course.

The participants were taught both theory and practical skills such as on-the-job training, riding skills and stable management which they can practise during special occasions and activities organised by DBKL.
