

# Afdlin denies City Hall misconduct claims

**KUALA LUMPUR:** Actor and director Datuk Afdlin Shauki has denied allegations of misconduct in the procurement of a project under Kuala Lumpur City Hall.

In an Instagram post, Afdlin said the issue was part of a deliberate attempt to tarnish his reputation.

“Recently, a post went viral on Telegram attempting to link me to allegations of misconduct in procuring a project under the purview of the Kuala Lumpur mayor,” he wrote.

“First and foremost, I strongly deny any element of misconduct in the procurement of this project. For everyone’s attention, this is an effort by irresponsible parties to damage my reputation.

“This agenda is solely driven by

envy and baseless vendetta.”

Afdlin said he had lodged a report on the accusations against him.

“I have been informed that City Hall is also conducting an inter-

nal investigation into the matter.

“As such, I urge everyone to allow the relevant authorities to carry out their duties.”

In the same post, Afdlin said he was prepared to fully cooperate with the authorities in the investigation.

“These malicious allegations and slander should not be allowed to spread unchecked.”

On Thursday, it was reported that City Hall had launched an internal probe into allegations of misconduct involving a board advisor linked to the awarding of an RM4 million project.

Mayor Datuk Seri Maimunah Mohd Sharif confirmed the investigation and said that City Hall was working closely with its integrity unit.
