CITY HALL WRAPPING UP PROBE

Investigation into RM4m project linked to Afdlin Shauki nears completion

THE internal investigation into allegations of misconduct involving actor and director Datuk Afdlin Shauki regarding a RM4 million procurement project by City Hall is in its final stages.

Minister in the Prime Minis-

ter's Department (Federal Territories) Dr Zaliha Mustafa said yesterday she had yet to receive a briefing from Mayor Datuk Seri Maimunah Mohd Sharif regarding the investigation's findings.

"I will determine a date to receive the briefing, which is expected soon.

"The Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission is also investigating this case, and we are co-

operating with the enforcement authorities."

She said this at the opening of the Federal Territory Day Sports Carnival here.

On Jan 28, City Hall launched an investigation into an advisory board member's alleged misconduct related to the award of a RM4 million project after the issue went viral.

The issue centres around the

alleged bypassing of governance processes linked to the procurement of the RM4 million project, which was not awarded via open tender to a company linked to Afdlin. He has denied any involvement in wrongdoing.

In a statement posted on Instagram, he said that the accusation was a fabrication by irresponsible parties to tarnish his reputation.
