

LEMBAH Pantai MP Fahmi Fadzil has pledged RM10,000 to support cycling initiatives under Kuala Lumpur City Cycling Club.

He announced this during the launch of an upcoming charity cycling event in conjunction with 50 years of the Federal Territories.

During the event at Royal Selangor Club (RSC) in Kuala Lumpur, former national cyclists were also recognised for their contributions to the sport.

Fahmi, who is also Communications Minister, spoke on the importance of supporting sports clubs and associations that benefitted city residents.
